FOCUS ON... JESUS THE REDEEMER

e are told in Mark Chapter 6 that the people of Nazareth who had known Jesus when he was growing up a as a youngster took offence at his ministry of teaching, preaching and healing. And that their scepticism and resistance prevented him from doing a lot of good work that he would have wished to do there. Of course, as a young person growing up in Nazareth, Jesus did not have to contend with the challenges of today's social media: and the tendency of the press to drag up long ago past mistakes and make those who made them accountable long after they have learned from those mistakes and grown as people. In today's world, young people - and others - can post something on social media which they later deeply regret and which long afterwards can come back to bite them. The press can hold politicians, and indeed others, to account for views that they once held and which they no longer themselves believe. But people do make mistakes, of course we do. and people can learn from their mistakes, of course we can. And as the cultural milieu changes, people can and do change with it - if they so choose. So, for example. Jonathan Aitken as a former MP was found to have been engaged in fraudulent activity and convicted of periury. But, whilst in prison he came to faith as a Christian in a prison prayer group which he says included "an armed robber, a blower (someone who cracks safes), a kiter (a cheque forger), a couple of murderers and a dipper (a pickpocket)". At Petertide 2018, he was ordained at St. Paul's Cathedral in order to serve as a prison chaplain. So therein is a real Gospel story of repentance and redemption. For, as we Christians proclaim, the foundation of the Gospel message - the message of the Cross of Jesus Christ - is that no-one is ever outside the scope of divine forgiveness if we seek to do our best to be humble about our faults and our frailties, and to be truly open ourselves to the love of God at work in our hearts and in our lives
