## WORSHIP AT ST. JOHN'S

Following the lifting of most remaining Lockdown restrictions, on 20<sup>th</sup> July, the PCC Standing Committee have agreed to the following changes to worship at St. John's for the immediate future:

- Although no longer legally required, we request that, for the time being due to Covid-19 infection rates remaining high, that the congregation do continue to wear masks in Church, maintain social distancing and sanitise their hands.
- The choir has resumed singing in Church during the main Sunday service. The congregation are invited to join in the singing of hymns but are requested to do so wearing their masks.
- Holy Communion will continue in one kind only for the time being and will be administered from the area in front of the chancel step (as we have been doing during lockdown).
- The Peace will continue for the time being to be observed discreetly and following social distancing protocols.
- The congregation are asked to observe social distancing as far as possible and the Lady Chapel area will be set aside as a mandatory social distancing area for those who feel they need to socially distance themselves from others. Please respect this.

## FOCUS ON ST. MATTHEW THE EVANGELIST

**S**t. Matthew was one of the twelve apostles of Jesus; someone who turned away from preoccupation with selfish gain and turned to Christ who changed his life. His feast-day is 21<sup>st</sup> September; and he is believed to have been martyred, possibly in Ethiopia or Persia. By tradition, he is identified as one of the four evangelists. It seems that St. Matthew was familiar with the material in Mark's Gospel, the first of the Gospels to have been written, as was St. Luke. And that Matthew and Luke both had access to other stories and sayings of Jesus which are collectively known as the "Q" source. But St. Matthew also has material found only in his Gospel narrative of which the best-known is his colourful and descriptive account of the Visit of the Magi to the infant Christ. Matthew's Gospel affirms to his readers time and again how the things that Jesus said and did were a fulfilment of Old Testament Messianic prophecy. And that the spiritual blessings which God conveys matter more than all the wealth in the world. These are indeed the pearl of great price, the essence of the Kingdom of God of redemption and forgiveness. The message of St. Matthew's Gospel, then, is "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and all these things will be added unto you". St. Matthew's symbol in Christian art is a representation of the winged creature with a human face in Revelation 4:7. This speaks both of the humanity of Jesus and of the genealogy of the ancestors of Jesus with which Matthew's Gospel begins. This is a major theme of Matthew's narrative - that the birth and life and death and resurrection of Jesus were all part of a divine plan for human salvation. In other words, these events in the Gospel narrative represent a cycle of salvation history that has origins which can be traced back to the beginning of time itself. Here in the person of Jesus Christ, says St. Matthew, is set out the divine plan serving the purposes of the living God, the God of love; the God who is the same yesterday, today, and forever.
