# FOCUS ON... THE VISIT OF THE VIRGIN MARY TO ELIZABETH

It is in the first chapter of Saint Luke's Gospel that we find the account of the visit of the Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth; an event which the Church commemorates on 31st May. The celebration of this feast-day was first observed at a Franciscan Order General Chapter in 1263. but quickly spread throughout Europe. Since it is a celebration clearly recorded in the Gospel, the Churches of the Reformation were disinclined to remove it from the liturgical calendar as they were for a number of other feast-days dedicated to the Virgin Mary, especially as this encounter was the occasion for Mary to sing the Magnificat, her great song of praise in honour of her Lord and God. The author of Saint Luke's Gospel sees John the Baptist as the last in the succession of the prophets of the old covenant, and he presents his account of the leaping of the unborn child in Elizabeth's womb as the first time that her son John the Baptist bears witness to the Christ as the promised Messiah. In doing so, Luke links the old covenant with the new. He appears to be saying that, just as the old covenant very clearly points to the identity of Jesus as the promised Messiah, so too John the Baptist as its last prophet, as yet unborn at the time of the meeting of these two holy women.
