
FOCUS ON...... THE LORD'S PRAYER

The Lord's Prayer is the prayer that Jesus taught to his disciples when they asked him how they should pray. It is used by every Christian tradition though there are sometimes minor variations in the text. It has a place in every act of worship within the Anglican tradition and provides a pattern and structure for Christian prayer through which we praise God and pray for our world, our communities, and our lives, to be shaped according to His will and purposes. Through our use of the words of the Lord's Prayer we also pray for our daily needs to be met, for forgiveness for wrongdoings, for strength to resist temptation, and for protection from danger. The text of the Lord's Prayer is found in two slightly different forms in Matthew Chapter 6 Verses 9 to 13 and Luke Chapter 11 Verses 1 to 4. The form of the Lord's Prayer as we use it today is a version that was adapted by the early Christian communities from these two Gospel texts and was taught in this form to new converts to the Christian faith. The final sentence, which gives glory to God, is known as the "doxology". This was not part of the original New Testament text but was added to it very early on. In some contexts, the Lord's Prayer can be said without it. And so the practice of prayer affirms to us that God is approachable; and that prayer is a spiritual activity that anyone can undertake which does not require of us complicated words and flowery text, or any special skills. Certainly, in our Church schools, and in many secular schools too, children learn from quite a young age to prayerfully recite, and in some schools also to sing, the Lord's Prayer. As we pray the Lord's Prayer, at the heart our prayers, then, will be words that Jesus himself taught us to pray. And so, we say that the Lord's Prayer is simple enough to be memorised by young children and yet it is profound enough to sustain a whole lifetime of faithful and dedicated prayer.
