FOCUS ON...WHEN IS ENOUGH. ENOUGH?

How much would vou need to make you feel really comfortable? We live in a culture based on accumulation of assets. But we cannot do this in isolation. The temptation is to store away a little bit more just in case. And so, when does prudence turn into greed? This is not a new issue. Jesus was walking in the street when a passer-by demanded of him "tell my brother to divide my father's estate with me". But Jesus took the opportunity to expand on the wider theme: "quard against every kind of greed. Life is not measured by what you own". As is often the case, the wrong question was asked and an unexpected answer was received. And so, we enter the world of the rich farmer, blessed with fertile land and high crop yields in excess of his needs. He has enough but he wants some more ... and then some more. And why? Not to share with his neighbours or the poor but in order to "take it easy, eat, drink and be merry". How we all like, from time to time, to "take it easy, to eat, drink and be merry". Indeed, Jesus was not averse to enjoying life with his friends and family, as at the wedding feast in Canaan and he promised life in all its abundance. But that is different from a life of devotion to personal. selfish indulgence at the exclusion of all else. And this is the crucial message. To follow God, would require the love and commitment of his heart and soul. And so, it is the same for us. God is willing us to choose a relationship with him above all other earthly desires. And he patiently waits for each of us to come to him in the reassurance that no-one will be turned away. As Jesus concludes: "Yes a person is a fool to store up earthly wealth but not have a rich relationship with God". In these times of foodbanks, refugees, inequalities and seemingly limitless needs around us both near and far, we are all called to reflect on what this story means to us and our lives today.
