FOCUS ON...HARVEST THANKSGIVING

Harvest Festival in our Churches and Schools has its origins in an initiative in 1843, when the Reverend Robert Hawker invited parishioners to a special thanksgiving service at Morwenstow in Cornwall and around the agricultural festivals of ancient Israel as prescribed in the Book of Deuteronomy. For Christians, then, celebrations on this day comprise the singing of Harvest hymns, pravers of thanksgiving, the decorating of Churches with the "fruits of the earth", and opportunities for almsgiving for those less fortunate. Alongside, food production from the land, the harvesting of our daily food includes of course the "harvest of the sea" as we give thanks for all those many people who play a role in the provision of our daily food. As we have come to rely less on homegrown produce, there has been a shift in the emphasis of many Harvest Festival celebrations. The topics embraced by Harvest prayers written in modern times have often been expanded to include such matters the "harvest of energy" as well as thanksgiving for the fruits of human labour in all kinds of fields of work and not simply the harvesting and production of food. And, increasingly, Churches have linked Harvest with support and concern for people in the developing world for whom growing crops of sufficient quantity and quality continues to be such a great struggle. For our 2022 Harvest Celebration we are making use of texts from a Harvest Carol Service written by Chris Thorpe and published by the Royal School of Church Music. It offers an opportunity to give thanks both for the goodness of creation as well as for a variety of aspects of our community and family life. It challenges us to behave morally and responsibly in our engagement with other people and in our attitude towards the created environment. It affirms to us that "all good gifts around us are sent from heaven above".
