#### **FOCUS ON...BIBLE SUNDAY**

The Church of England's doctrinal attitude to the Bible is summed up in the Westminster Confession of faith which was agreed by the Church in 1646 and approved by Parliament in 1648. The Bible, says the Westminster Confession, contains "all that is necessary for salvation"! The Bible remains a best-seller has now been translated into over 1500 languages and it consists of books written by many different authors over many hundreds of years. It comprises the 39 books of the Old Testament and the 27 books of the New Testament, In addition, for the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches, but not the Protestant Churches, the Bible also includes the 15 books of the Apocrypha. In the Church of England, the Apocrypha has long been regarded as suitable for private study and meditation but only in more recent times as Holy Scripture for public reading. Taken as a whole, the Bible is a collection of history, poetry, drama, prophecy, law, philosophy, and many other things besides. However, it is important to realise that it is primarily theology. In other words, we do not turn to the Bible for accurate geography or history. or for a scientific explanation of the creation. Instead, we turn to the Bible for understanding of God's ways of dealing with humankind. Almost every kind of human experience - both good and bad - is in some way to be found in the Bible: and, for the Christian, the Bible taken as a whole is "salvation history", the record of God's saving work which Christians identify to be pre-figured in the Old Testament and supremely disclosed in the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. This is the reason why the four Gospels are treated with special reverence in our Eucharistic worship. This is why we stand to hear the Gospels read out in Church and take the Gospel book in procession to the place where it is to be read. Because the Gospels represent for us the words of Jesus spoken directly to his Church.
