FOCUS ON...ALL SAINTS

All Saints' Day is also known as All Hallows' Day, the Feast of All Saints, the Feast of All Hallows, the Solemnity of All Saints, and as Hallowmas It is an observance celebrated in honour of all of the Saints of the Church, whether they are known or unknown. Feastdays commemorating all Christian martyrs are known to have been held in various places in the Fourth Century, on dates near to the Festivals of Easter and Pentecost. In the 9th century, some Churches in the British Isles began holding the commemoration of all saints on the 1st November, and in the 9th century this was extended to the whole Catholic church by Pope Gregory IV. In Western Christianity, it is still celebrated on 1st November by the Roman Catholic Church as well as many Protestant churches, notably the Anglican, Lutheran and Methodist traditions. The Eastern Orthodox Church and associated Fastern Churches celebrate All Saints' Day on the first Sunday after Pentecost. The Church of the East and the Syro-Malabar and the Chaldean Catholic. the latter of which is in communion with Rome, celebrate All Saints' Day on the first Friday after Easter Sunday. In the Coptic Orthodox tradition of Egypt, All Saints' Day is on Navrouz, celebrated on 11th September. This day is both the start of the Coptic New Year and the first month of the Coptic calendar which is called. Thout. But. of course. the Saints cannot really be said to belong to any distinct denominational tradition. Their lives and witness to Jesus can be appreciated and celebrated by all Christian people within the wider family of the universal Christian Church. And among this countless host of holy men and women, are included those faithful souls who have especially been responsible for actions and events that have played a part in shaping our lives, helping us in our own journey of faithful discipleship.
