FOCUS ON...HOLY BAPTISM

The Order of Service for the sacrament of Holy Baptism comprises a number of symbolic actions of theological significance and meaning. Firstly, there are the promises that parents and godparents make - or in the case of an older child or an adult made by the candidate themselves - promises which are concerned with belief and trust in God our Creator as He is known to us in the person of Jesus Christ and through the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Next comes the sign of the Cross made on the candidate's forehead which is a sign of commitment to Christ as our Saviour and Redeemer. Often this sign of the Cross involves the use of Holy Oil blessed by our Bishop on Maundy Thursday. Then there is the handing over of the child to be Baptised, or in the case of an older child or an adult their own decision to receive the Gospel sacrament of Baptism, through which the candidate is received into membership of the universal Christian Church. Baptism is very much a family event; both for the proud family of the person being Baptised as well as for the wider family of the Church. The deepest symbolism in the rite of Baptism is, of course, the act of Baptising with water: whether this be by sprinkling or by immersion. Water is of itself a very rich symbol of creation, of cleansing, of new birth, of the reviving of our spirit, of life itself. To the very best of our knowledge and belief, life simply cannot exist for very long at all without the presence of water. And, lastly, there is the giving of a lit candle to the candidate or, in the case of the very young, to his or her parent or sponsor. This Baptismal candle is lit from the Paschal candle, which is a new candle each year lit for the first time on Easter Day and then throughout the Easter season; and then lit throughout the year at services of Baptism and Confirmation. The Paschal candle is symbolic of the resurrection faith of the Church and it affirms to us our faith that Jesus Christ is the light of the world.
