FOCUS ON... SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST

John the Baptist was active in the area of the River Jordan in the early part of the First Century and he is a major religious figure in Christianity as well as Islam in which he is known as the Prophet Yahva, the Bahâi faith, the Druze faith, and Mandaeism. All of these faiths consider John to be Prophet of God. In the Christian tradition. John the Baptist is honoured as a Saint. He is mentioned in the writings of the First Century Romano-Jewish historian Josephus. According to the New Testament testimony, in his preaching. John anticipated a Messianic figure greater than himself; and the Gospels portray John as the forerunner to Jesus. Jesus himself identifies John the Baptist as "Elijah which is to come" which is a reference to an Old Testament text in Malachi Chapter 4 Verse 5, as well as being predicted in the angelic message of John's birth to his Father Zechariah in Luke Chapter 1. Some Bible scholars associate John the Baptist with the Essenes who were a semiascetic mystic Jewish sect who looked for the coming of the Messiah and practised ritual Baptism. The Essenes flourished from the Second Century BC to the First Century AD. They are identified with the Qumran caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were deposited. The Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in a series of 12 caves in the West Bank (then part of Jordan) between 1946 and 1956 by Bedouin shepherds and a team of archaeologists; with further discoveries being made in 2017 and 2021. Most Bible scholars agree that John did Baptise Jesus and several New Testament texts report that some of the followers of Jesus had previously been followers of John. According to the New Testament, John was beheaded by Herod Antipas around AD30 after John had rebuked him for divorcing his wife Phasaelis and unlawfully marrying Herodias, wife of his brother, with the historian Josephus recording that this execution took place at the fortress at Machaerus. In modern times, followers of John the Baptist are the Mandaeans who believe that he is their greatest and final Prophet.
