FOCUS ON... THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

On the Fourth Sunday of Advent, we the light the fourth candle on the Advent Wreath in commemoration of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mother of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. It has been said that she was a "Jewish maiden, called Miriam in Hebrew, traditionally of the family of King David". In Islam, Mary is known Maryam and she is honoured for her obedience to the divine will and for her devotion to prayer. The Gospel of Luke tells us that she was living at Nazareth when an angel appeared to her and announced that by the power of the Holy Spirit she would bear a son, Jesus, to be known as the Son of God. Luke tells us that Mary accepted this astonishing message in the words "Behold the handmaid of the Lord! Be it unto me according to thy word." The angel also told her that her aged relative Elizabeth was with child (the child being John the Baptist). Mary went to visit Elizabeth who greeted her as the angel had done" Blessed art thou among women! And blessed is the fruit of thy womb!" And Mary gave voice to the song of praise and thanksgiving which we know as the Magnificat, and which begins "My soul doth magnify the Lord!" We are also told that Joseph took her to wife and that, when they had to travel to Bethlehem for a census, it was there that the child Jesus was born. Luke also tells us that "Mary kept all these things and pondered them in her heart." According to the Gospel of Matthew, Magi coming from Eastern regions arrived at Bethlehem where Jesus and his family were living, and they fell down and worshiped him bringing gifts of gold, frankingense and myrrh. Joseph was then warned in a dream that King Herod wanted to murder the infant, and so the Holy Family fled by night to Egypt and staved there for some time. After the death of Herod the Great, the Holv Family returned to Nazareth in Galilee, rather than Bethlehem, because Herod's son Archelaus had by then become the ruler of Judaea.
