#### FOCUS ON... ST. BASIL & ST. GREGORY

Basil of Caesarea, also known as Basil the Great, and Gregory of Nazianzus are commemorated on 2nd January as "teachers of the faith". They are both said to have been born in the year 330 and were best friends who, after studying together in Athens, returned to their native Cappadocia in what is now Eastern Turkey. Basil was born into the wealthy Cappadocian Greek family of Basil the Elder and Emmelia of Caesarea. He was one of ten children, and his parents were known for their Christian piety. Gregory's father, also named Gregory, was converted to the Christian faith from the monotheistic sect known as the Hypsistarii under the influence of his Christian wife Nonna. Together Basil and Gregory sought to promote and defend the divinity of Christ as proclaimed in the Nicene Creed at a time when there was strong pressure from both Church and State for the establishment of Arianism, a heresy which denied the divinity of Christ and thus the whole doctrine of the Holy Trinity. Basil is said to have been renowned for being headstrong and forceful. But his friend Gregory is said to have preferred to spend his days in prayer and living a simple, ascetic life. However, Gregory's brilliance in oratory and theological debate meant that the quiet life he was drawn to was not possible and Basil drew him into the forefront of the Arian controversy. The persuasive eloquence of their teaching was what convinced the First Council of Constantinople, meeting in 381, that their teaching was the truly orthodox form of Christian doctrine. The Council ratified the text of the Nicene Creed in the form in which it is still used today in the Churches of the Greek and Russian Orthodox tradition. Basil the Great, his brother Gregory of Nyssa, together with Basil's friend Gregory of Nazianzus, are known as the Cappadocian Fathers. Basil died on 1st or 2nd January 379, and his friend Gregory some eleven years later around 25th January 390.
