FOCUS ON... CANDLEMAS

The Feast of the Presentation of Christ at the Temple in Jerusalem, traditionally known as Candlemas, brings the 40 days of the Christmas and Epiphany season to an end. It is perceived as a crossroads moment in the liturgical year as it also begins to direct our thoughts towards the coming season of Lent, Holy Week and Easter -"one last look back at Christmas", it is said, "then turn towards the Cross". St. Luke's Gospel Chapter 2 tells us that, 40 days after his birth, Mary and Joseph took the baby Jesus to the Temple to do for him what was prescribed by the Law of Moses, the ritual acts of purification after childbirth and redemption of the first-born son. The characters in St. Luke's account of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple are faithful to, and nurtured by, the very best of the Jewish tradition; not least Mary and Joseph and, of course, the child Jesus Himself. Entering this story is Simeon - close to God, sensitive to God, guided by the Spirit. Such a person as this has a knack of turning up at just the right time, understanding the significance of what they see and saying the exactly right thing. Whilst many would see just a child, Simeon sees salvation - salvation for all the earth. Led by the Spirit, the freshness and power of Simeon's words of prophecy concerning this child of destiny amaze the parents. He speaks of the redemption of the world through Jesus Christ. But he forewarns that this will not be achieved without very real cost. To Mother Mary he says "and a sword will pierce your own soul too". The prophetess Anna, like Simeon, turns up at just the right time. She too understands precisely what it is that she sees. And she is unable to keep this to herself - she cannot help but talk about it. And then there is the praising - those present who are close to God are praising the wonders of God's nature and the marvels of God's acts among us. Here, then, is the beginning of a whole new life for all of us, made possible by this very special child.
