FOCUS ON... ST. MATTHIAS

In the Book of Common Prayer calendar, Saint Matthias is commemorated on 24th February, However, in modern lectionaries including Common Worship, his saint's day falls on 14th May. This change was made so that his feast-day did not fall in Lent but instead in proximity to Ascension Day. According to the Acts of the Apostles (written c. AD 63). Matthias was chosen by the Apostles to replace Judas Iscariot following the latter's betraval of Jesus and his subsequent death. His calling as an Apostle is unique, in that his appointment was not made personally by Jesus. who had already ascended into heaven, and it was also made before the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the early Church. He is said to have planted the faith around Cappadocia and on the coasts of the Caspian Sea, residing chiefly near the port Issus. According to the historian Nicephorus, Matthias first preached the Gospel in Judaea, then in Ethiopia (by the region of Colchis, now in modern-day Georgia) and was crucified. An ancient Coptic text, the Acts of Andrew and Matthias, also places his activity in Ethiopia. And the Synopsis of Dorotheus also contains the tradition that he preached "in the interior of Ethiopia": and affirms that "he died at Sebastopolis, and was buried there, near the Temple of the Sun." Alternatively. another tradition maintains that Matthias was stoned at Jerusalem by the local populace, and then beheaded. But according to Hippolytus of Rome, Matthias died of old age in Jerusalem. There are claims that the Apostle's mortal remains were brought to Italy by the Empress Helena, mother of Emperor the Great). That being so, part of these relics would be interred in the Abbey of Santa Giustina. Padua, and the remaining in the Abbey of St. Matthias. Trier. Germany. However, a marker placed in the ruins of the Roman fortress at Gonio (Apsaros) in the modern Georgian region of Adiara supports the claim of Greek sources that Matthias is buried at that site.
