FOCUS ON... ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE

In Chapter 20 of St. John's Gospel, we read that St. Thomas the Apostle was not present when the Risen Lord Jesus first appeared to the Apostles in the Upper Room. When a week later. Jesus appeared again to the disciples in the Upper Room Thomas was present. We are told that Jesus said to them "peace be with you". St. John's account tell us that Thomas was given the opportunity to feel for himself the marks and scars of Crucifixion. Whereupon he responded with the acclamation "My Lord and My God". Jesus then said to Thomas "have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and vet have come to believe." The underlying message for us is that the followers of Jesus do not need to be given physical scientific proof of the resurrection in order to have faith and trust that Jesus is indeed risen and that he is Lord both of the dead and the living. So. what matters most of all in the narrative of the resurrection appearance of the risen Lord Jesus to St. Thomas the Apostle is not so much his initial doubt and questioning but his confession of faith and trust in his Lord and ours. Clearly, for Thomas the Apostle, this encounter was therefore a life-changing experience as it is for all those who have welcomed the risen Lord into their lives. According to tradition. Thomas is said to have travelled well beyond the territory of the Roman Empire to preach the Gospel, even travelling as far as Kerala in present-day India where he is said to have baptized several people. At Eastertide, then, it is as if the Church is suddenly full of blazing light radiating from that still elusive vet joyful presence. Out of that light comes to us a new voice, clear and true. "Peace be with you," the voice says, filling us with a sense of new life. And so let us seek to be like Thomas: honest before God and others, open to questioning faith and seeking truth, but ready to bow down in worship of our Lord and Saviour who meets us just where we are.
