FOCUS ON... ASCENSION DAY

Ascension Day occurs on the fortieth day of Easter (39 days after Easter Day) and so it always falls on a Thursday, although some Churches nowadays hold their Ascension Day commemoration on the Sunday immediately afterwards. In some traditions. Ascension Day is also known as Holy Thursday though this term in more commonly applied to Maundy Thursday in Holy Week. Here at St. John's Church. our Ascension Day service takes place at 7.30pm on Ascension Day itself which this year is Thursday 18th May. According to the Book of Acts, after his resurrection, the risen Jesus is said to have appeared to his disciples on several occasions over a period of some forty days when he was taken up into heaven. So it is this event that is central to our keeping of Ascension Day, and as we look towards Pentecost 10 days later when we commemorate the gift of the Holy Spirit, and as we celebrate what is effectively the birthday of the world-wide Christian Church. Ascension Day is a public holiday in many countries, including Indonesia despite Christianity being a minority religion there, with special Church Services taking place. In England, Ascension Day is traditionally associated with various water festivals ranging from Well Dressing in Derbyshire to the Planting of the "Penny Hedge" at the seaside town of Whitby in Yorkshire. Other traditional Ascension Day customs include "beating the bounds". In olden days, this practice seemingly went as far as the beating of boys with willow branches as they were driven along Parish boundaries. to "purify them of evil" and teaching them the limits of their Parish! Mercifully, in modern times, "beating the bounds" simply involves people in the locality walking around their Farm, Manorial, Church or Civil boundaries, pausing as they pass certain trees, walls and hedges, denoting the extent of the boundary in order to exclaim, to pray, and to ritually 'beat' particular landmarks with sticks.
