#### FOCUS ON... TRINITY SUNDAY

"The Lord works in mysterious ways", so says Elmore Blues time and time again in the two Blues Brothers movies. "The Lord works in mysterious ways". And at no time in the Church's calendar is the divine mystery more at the heart of our worship than it is on Trinity Sunday. In fact, the theologian Rudolf Otto invented the word "numinous", derived from a Latin word "numen", in order to describe our sense of awe at the majesty of God. Although the word "Trinity" itself never appears in the Bible, we can see in Scripture how the early Church sought to engage with this mystery of One God who is also Three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Later generations of Christians discovered this to be to be a very helpful way to try to describe the indescribable, the mysterious concept of a Three-in-One God. What does clearly emerge in the New Testament, however, is a simple acceptance that there is only one God, yet there are three distinct characters who are, nevertheless. each quite definitely God. So, then, no clever models of intersecting triangles, or overlapping circles, nor the leaves of a shamrock, appear in the Bible. This would come later, as subsequent generations of Christians tried to make sense of this paradoxical experience of faith - and to seek to describe it to others. For the earliest followers of Jesus Christ there was just a simple acceptance that these Three Persons relate to one another, communicate with one another and with us, yet are One! In Isaiah Chapter 6, the prophet tells how he fell down in worship before the awesome majesty of God! And we too recognise that God's essential nature is in so many ways a deep and unsearchable mystery. Christian living, then, is about trusting in a God of loving relationship, self-emptying, and self-giving for the sake of the love of another. This indeed is the divine mystery at the heart of Trinitarian faith.
