
FOCUS ON... THE CREATION OF ADAM

Hands have always been a fascinating theme for artists. Michelangelo's painting of the hands of God and Adam reaching out to almost touch on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel in Rome is awe-inspiring, reminding us of how, through many millennia, the human race has been called to bear the image of God. This famous fresco, The Creation of Adam (Italian: Creazione di Adamo). forms part of the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel of St. Peter's Basilica. It illustrates the Biblical creation narrative from the Book of Genesis in which God gives life to Adam, the first human being. The fresco is part of a complex iconographic scheme and is chronologically the fourth in the series of panels depicting episodes from the Book of Genesis. The Creation of Adam is said to be one of the most replicated religious paintings of all time. In the fresco The Creation of Adam. God is depicted as an elderly white-bearded man, wrapped in a swirling cloak, with his right arm outstretched to impart the spark of life from his own finger into that of Adam, whose left arm is extended in a pose mirroring God's, a reminder that God said "let us make humankind in our image" (Genesis 1:26). It is believed that the inspiration for Michelangelo's treatment of the subject may have stemmed from the mediaeval hymn Veni Creator Spiritus which asks the "finger of the paternal right hand" (digitus patternae dexterae) to endow the faithful with speech. The index fingers of God and Adam are separated by a small gap and some scholars think that this represents the unattainability of humanity being able to achieve divine perfection. There have been a number of hypotheses regarding the identity and meaning of the twelve figures depicted around God. One popular theory identifies the person protected by God's left arm as representing Eve. Other theories suggest that this plainly feminine figure represents the Virgin Mary, Sophia the personification of Wisdom, the personified human soul, or simply "an angel of feminine build".
