### FOCUS ON... LANCELOT ANDREWES

In the liturgical calendar of the Anglican Communion, Lancelot Andrewes is commemorated on 25<sup>th</sup> September. He was an English Bishop and scholar, who held high positions in the Church of England during the reigns of Elizabeth I and James L. As a theologian and court preacher Lancelot Andrewes sought to defend and advance Anglican doctrines during a period of great strife in the English Church. He served successively as Bishop of Chichester, of Elv, and of Winchester; and he oversaw the translation of the Authorised Version of the Bible (also known as the King James Version). Andrewes was born in Barking in the year 1555 and educated at Merchant Taylors' School and then Pembroke Hall in Cambridge. Ordained priest in 1580, he was incorporated Master of Arts at Oxford in 1581. As catechist at his College, he delivered lectures on the Ten Commandments which were published in 1630. Each year he would spend a month with his parents; and, during this vacation. he would find a master from whom he would learn a language of which he had no previous knowledge. In this way, after a few years, he had acquired a working knowledge of most of the modern languages of Europe. In 1617 he accompanied King James I to Scotland with a view to seeking to persuade the Scots that Episcopacy was preferable to Presbyterianism. He was made Dean of the Chapel Royal and it was in the year 1619 that he was appointed Bishop of Winchester, a Diocese that he administered with great success. His preaching and teaching proved highly influential; and his holiness of life and gentle nature endeared him to all who met him. Following his death in 1626 in his Southwark Palace, he was mourned alike by leaders in Church and State. His mortal remains were interred beside the High Altar in St. Saviour's Church in what was then the Diocese of Winchester but is now the Cathedral Church for the Diocese of Southwark.
