FOCUS ON... ST. MICHAEL & ALL ANGELS

The feast-day of Saint Michael and All Angels occurs on 29th September: being the date of the dedication in honour of Saint Michael of an ancient Church near Rome. Michael, Gabriel and Raphael are the three angels whose names we know from Scripture. Michael means 'who is like God' and is portrayed as the protector of Israel and the leader of the armies of God, perhaps best known as the slaver of the dragon in the Book of Revelations. Michael is therefore seen as the protector of Christians from the wiles of the devil. Gabriel means 'the strength of God' and was sent by God to Mary to announce the birth of Christ, Raphael means 'the healing of God' and is depicted in the Book of Tobit, as the one who restores Tobit's sight. We can say that the continuing power of angelology in wider culture is well demonstrated by popularity of the song by Robbie Williams containing these lyrics: "I sit and wait: does an angel contemplate my fate; and do they know; the places where we go; when we're grev and old: 'cause I have been told: that salvation lets their wings unfold. So, when I'm lying in my bed; thoughts running through my head; and I feel the love is dead: I'm loving angels instead". The theologian Rudolf Otto used the word "numinous" to describe the innate nature of the holy which he described using the phrase "mysterium tremendum et fascinans": that which conjures up a sense of fearfulness but also overwhelming attraction. In fact, the intention of our worship is to express at least something of our fearfulness, and our awe and wonder, at the majesty of the living God. In other words, as best we can within our human limitations, to align the song of worship of we mortals here on earth with the song of the angels in heaven. And so bring into being the sense that the veil between earth and heaven is very thin and that we may thus be lifted up, at least in part, to catch some glimpse of the panoply of heaven and the glory of God.
