
FOCUS ON ... THE PARABLE OF THE TALENTS

The Parable of the Talents in Matthew Chapter 25 Verses 14 to 30 is part of a series of Parables at the end of Matthew's Gospel, all with the theme of judgement. It affirms that our talents are given to us on trust and that we are each held responsible for full and faithful use of these gifts. The reward for good service may very well be a larger responsibility in the work of God's kingdom, but we are told that inaction and timidity will bring judgement and greater loss. The Gospel story therefore devotes more space to the exchange between the master and the "wicked" slave – and to his fate – than anything else. "Of him to whom much is given, much will be expected." The mother of the billionaire founder of Microsoft, Bill Gates, said these words to her son shortly after he was married and just before she died. Our gifts are indeed unique to us in both nature and quantity; and we are therefore dutybound to use them in ways that will help and enrich others, and not just for our own benefit. We will have varying opportunities presented to us in the course of our lives. Opportunities to influence others, or to help shape a course of events. Also relevant to this whole matter is our availability. So often in the Bible, when there is a particular task to be accomplished, it seems that God does not necessarily look at the ability or inability of a person, but their availability. Some people, perhaps blessed with more devotion to God than any obvious talents, make themselves available by their willingness to serve. Whatever our talents, we must never let them wither from lack of use. We are to do what we do, to the best of our ability, and with as much focus and attention as we can muster. Like the servants in the Parable of the Talents, we are stewards of what we have been given and, as St Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy". If we are truly faithful and trustworthy stewards for God, serving him should never be for us a chore.
