#### FOCUS ON ... CHRIST THE KING

There is a paradox at the heart of Kingship, of any monarchy, or any kind of political leadership. Those who become leaders are called to do so in order to serve their people. and to promote the well-being of their people in every aspect of life rather than further their own interests. The sad truth is that the course of history has been marked from time to time by leaders who have done exactly the opposite. They have claimed power for their own selfish ends; they have sought personal gain at the expense of their people. and they have caused them enormous pain and suffering and deprivation. The fullest expression of the paradox of quality leadership, however, is to be found in the life of Jesus Christ. None of the claims that Jesus made about himself were made for his own glory or personal benefit. Not even when he stood up to read in his home synagogue at Nazareth the passage from Isaiah beginning "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me..." and then followed the reading with the words "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing". And there is one particular expression that recurs time and again in the Gospels, Jesus refers to himself time and again as "the Son of Man". And so, we read that "the Son of Man has nowhere to lav his head." And that "the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many." This is perhaps the ultimate expression of leadership through service and self-sacrifice, but it also carries overtones of the Kingship of Christ. Because it is this same "Son of Man" who will come. we are told, "in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his throne of glory". But Jesus teaches us that his Kingship is primarily to be seen in those in need, made manifest in those who most need our care and support, those who we are called to serve for the sake of Christ our Lord and King. And it is in our caring for them that we give glory to him: our Saviour Jesus Christ, the Suffering Servant, the chosen Messiah. the Lord of Lords, the King of Glory,
