FOCUS ON ... THE ADVENT WREATH - PEACE

On Advent Sunday we lit the first candle on the Advent Wreath and celebrated the patriarchs. On the Second Sunday of Advent we light it again as we place our hope in Jesus the blessing of God for all nations; and we now also light the second candle, the peace candle, as we reflect on the message of expectation and anticipation that we find in the teachings of the Old Testament prophets and most notably in this prophecy of Isaiah: "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son; and shall name him Immanuel". (Isaiah 7:14). The timeless message of the Old Testament prophets was one of judgement and restoration. They proclaimed that the long-expected Messiah would establish God's kingdom, transform creation, and be a source of blessing to all the nations, thereby fulfilling the purpose of God's ancient covenant with Abraham. They taught that God calls us to repentance, that God loves us unconditionally, that God uses ordinary people to serve his purposes, that God is both gracious and just, and that God has a plan and purpose for our lives.

Lord God you spoke through your prophets and promised a kingdom of peace. We welcome you Lord Jesus, the Prince of Peace and our hearts long for the establishment of your kingdom of justice and righteousness. **Amen**.


As the second candle is lighted:
