FOCUS ON ... THE WEDDING AT CANA

This was the first sign performed by Jesus in Galilee only a few days after his baptism by John the Baptist. The role of Mary, the mother of Jesus, is interesting. She notices that the wine is about to run out but has faith that Jesus can solve the problem. He appears reluctant to become involved at first: "this is not our problem" as the time for his revelation had not yet fully come. But he does help by a simple command to the servants to fill six vast iars with water. The result; over 500 bottles of top-quality wine! What does all this mean? Far from being an act of showmanship, it was deeply symbolic showing the quality and quantity of God's providence which will satisfy all our needs beyond measure. It resonates with the biblical images of the heavenly banquet and Christ as the bridegroom and the church as his bride. And the Jewish purification iars were transformed by the ultimate high priest into an offering for the purification of our souls which we remember each time we partake of the wine at our Eucharist. So let us give thanks for the generosity of our heavenly Father and accept his invitation to celebrate, like the bride and groom, the start of a new life together.


